## Answers to Bidder's Questions

- Question: Is a temporary generator required for this project? Answer: ADD PARAGRAPH 'H' TO THE ELECTRICAL SPECIFICATION, 1.22 PHASING, DEMOLITION AND MAINTAINING EXISTING SERVICES H. TEMPORARY GENERATOR
  - 1. The Electrical Contractor shall provide 60KW, 120/208v, 3 Phase, 4 wire portable generator to be connected to the existing automatic transfer switch (ATS) during the removal of the existing generator being replaced. During the time when the existing ATS is being replaced with the new ATS, the temporary generator will be disconnected and reconnected as required to ensure that the building will not be without back-up power generation.
- 2. Question: Is there an asbestos report for the exhaust on the generator? If so, who is responsible for it?

**Answer:** The exhaust stack is to be disconnected at the flange prior to any insulation. No asbestos work will be required.



 Question: With regards to the attached bid, one of the items to submit on the checklist is the OSHA certification form but I do not see it in the documents. Can you please kindly forward me a copy.

Answer: A copy is attached to this addendum.

 Question: "Previous Participation Certification" is included in the bid specs but NOT on the list of bid submission checklist. Does this need to be included in the bid submittal? Answer: It is not required to be in the bid, but submission is preferred. Bids submitted without this form will NOT be rejected.

Any person submitting a bid for, signing a contract to work on, the construction, reconstruction, alteration, remodeling or repair of any building or public works project undertaken by a public awarding authority in Massachusetts and estimated to cost more than \$10,000 must certify on the bid or contract, under penalties of perjury, as follows:

- 1. That he/she is able to furnish labor than can work in harmony with all other elements of labor employed or to be employed at the work
- 2. All employees to be employed at the worksite will have successfully completed a course in construction safety and health approved by the United States Occupational Safety and Health Administration that is at least 10 hours in duration at the time the employee begins work and who shall furnish documentation of successful completion of said course with the first certified payroll report for each employee; and
- That all employees to be employed in the work subject to this bid have successfully completed a course in construction safety and health approved by the United States Occupational Safety and Health Administration that is at least 10 hours in duration. (MGL. c. 30, Section 39S (a))

Pursuant to M.G.L. c. 30, Section 39M and M.G.L. c. 149, I certify under penalties of perjury that, to the best of my Knowledge and belief, I am in compliance with the OSHA requirements as stated above.
